Visitors to Canada in July will discover a nation at its most vibrant. Summer brings long days, warm weather, and a nationwide celebration of sport, culture, and community. Cities and regions alike offer clean environments, efficient infrastructure, and a welcoming, multicultural population. Whether exploring urban centres like Montréal or the natural beauty beyond them, participants and guests will experience a country that values excellence in sport, respect for nature, and the power of international connection.

Hosting the 2026 ICF Canoe Sprint and Paracanoe World Cup in Canada reflects these strengths—uniting athletes from around the world in a setting shaped by water, history, and a genuine passion for sport.

CITY OF MONTRÉAL

A World-Class Host City

Montréal is one of North America's great international cities, known for its vibrant culture, rich sporting heritage, and distinctive European character. A truly bilingual metropolis, it blends French and English influences with a cosmopolitan energy that has made it a global destination for sport, festivals, cuisine, and creativity. The city has hosted the 1976 Olympic Games, World Championships, Formula 1's Canadian Grand Prix, and countless international competitions, earning a reputation as an experienced and enthusiastic host.

Beyond sport, Montréal is celebrated for its exceptional cultural life. In mid-July, the city is at its most dynamic, with streets, parks, and waterfronts alive with music, outdoor performances, and festivals. Visitors enjoy world-class museums, historic neighbourhoods such as Old Montréal, and an outstanding culinary scene, from fine dining to iconic local favourites like smoked meat and fresh bagels.

Parc Jean-Drapeau, the event venue, lies just minutes from downtown and is surrounded by water, green space, and sweeping skyline views. July brings warm weather, long daylight hours, and an outdoor lifestyle that perfectly complements high-performance sport. With lively patios, efficient public transit, and safe, walkable neighbourhoods, Montréal offers more than a competition venue. It delivers a memorable host experience for all participants in the 2026 ICF Canoe Sprint and Paracanoe World Cup.

Weather Conditions (Mid-July)

Based on long-term climate patterns for Montréal, the event period typically experiences warm to occasionally hot summer conditions, with moderate-to-high humidity.

- Daytime temperatures: ~25–27°C (average daily highs around 26°C)
- Overnight temperatures: ~16–19°C (typical lows around 17°C)
- Occasional highs: ~30–33°C during hotter spells
- Humidity: Moderate to higher humidity
- Daylight: Approximately 15 to 15.5 hours of daylight in early–mid July
- Typical winds: Often in the ~10–20 km/h range
- Prevailing direction: Predominantly W (commonly W to SW flows)



PARC JEAN DRAPEAU

A Legacy of Excellence

Parc Jean-Drapeau is one of Canada's most iconic sport and event sites, with a history rooted in global celebration and elite competition. Created for Expo 67—one of the most successful world exhibitions ever held—the park transformed Île Sainte-Hélène and the newly built Île Notre-Dame into a showcase of innovation, culture, and international exchange. Less than a decade later, the site became a centrepiece of the 1976 Olympic Games, hosting rowing and canoeing events on the Olympic Basin, purpose-built to international standards and still in use today.

Since then, Parc Jean-Drapeau has remained a premier destination for major international sport. Its Olympic Basin has welcomed World Cups, continental championships, national championships, and high-performance training camps across rowing, canoe sprint, paracanoe, and dragon boat disciplines. For the paddling community, the venue is synonymous with excellence—offering a technically fair course, reliable conditions, and a unique urban backdrop that combines world-class sport with a vibrant city skyline.

Beyond competition, the park embodies Montréal's commitment to legacy and sustainability. Modernized facilities, accessible transport links, and expansive green spaces make it both a high-performance venue and a public gathering place. Hosting the 2026 ICF Canoe Sprint and Paracanoe World Cup at Parc Jean-Drapeau continues a tradition that spans nearly 60 years—connecting today's athletes with a storied Olympic past and reinforcing Montréal's place on the world stage of paddling sport.

TRAVEL INFORMATION

Montréal–Trudeau International Airport (YUL)

All international participants and delegates should plan their travel to **Montréal–Trudeau International Airport (YUL)**, the city's primary international gateway. YUL offers direct and one-stop connections from major global hubs. When booking flights, ensure your final destination is Montréal (YUL), as arriving via another Canadian city will require a domestic transfer and additional time.

Upon arrival, travelers will clear Canadian border control and customs. Most passengers should plan for approximately 45 to 90 minutes from landing to exiting the terminal, with longer processing times possible during peak summer arrival periods.

The airport is located approximately 20 kilometres from downtown Montréal and Parc Jean-Drapeau. Under normal conditions, ground transportation takes 25 to 30 minutes. During weekday peak hours, generally 7:00–9:00 a.m. and 3:30–6:30 p.m., travel times can increase to 45–60 minutes. July is a busy tourism period in Montréal, and heavier traffic volumes should be expected.

CSP Rules 2026

15.1.5 – Each National Federation may enter a maximum of two (2) boats per event in the World Cup competition.

Numerical entries are due May 25, 2026 at 23:59 CET

Nominal entries are due June 29, 2026 at 23:59 CET

Athlete Name and Country Code Stickers

The athlete's name sticker must be applied on all boats for ICF Canoe Sprint Competitions. In order for the canoes and kayaks to be presented in a standard manner, the name stickers must be positioned at the same point on every boat. The Country code sticker will be applied on all boats and at the same place for each ICF Canoe Sprint competition. The stickers will be checked at the Boat Control. **It is the participating National Federations' responsibility to provide the stickers to their athletes.**

PARTICIPATION FEES

Participation fees for the 2026 Canoe Sprint and Paracanoe World Cup will cost **€30** per participant per day. Participation fees are included for anyone that opts in to an Events Accommodations Package.

The 2026 ICF Canoe Sprint and Paracanoe World Cup's logistics partner, Tournkey Travel have provided accommodation options for participants at several hotels. Though there are many spaces available at each hotel, we encourage you to book your accommodations early.

Booking priority will function on a first come, first served basis.

All hotels are in close proximity to the race course, each within a 8km/25 minute drive, and 35 minutes via metro, of the venue. A shuttle and metro service to and from the event venue will be available for all locations listed below. Those who choose to stay in accommodations not listed will not have access to these services through the HOC.

Breakfast at the hotel, lunches at the venue, and dinner at the hotel are included in the packages. Participant fees are also included in the packages. Should your federation have specific dining requirements for breakfast or dinner, please specify any requests you may have when submitting your reservation request. Tournkey Travel can coordinate custom meal packages directly with the hotel, where available.

Payment Schedule

All preliminary entry and hotel reservations are due on **April 7th**. Following your federation's approval of the quote, an initial deposit of **50%** of your anticipated fees will be due. The remaining balance of your federation's payments will be due on the following schedule:

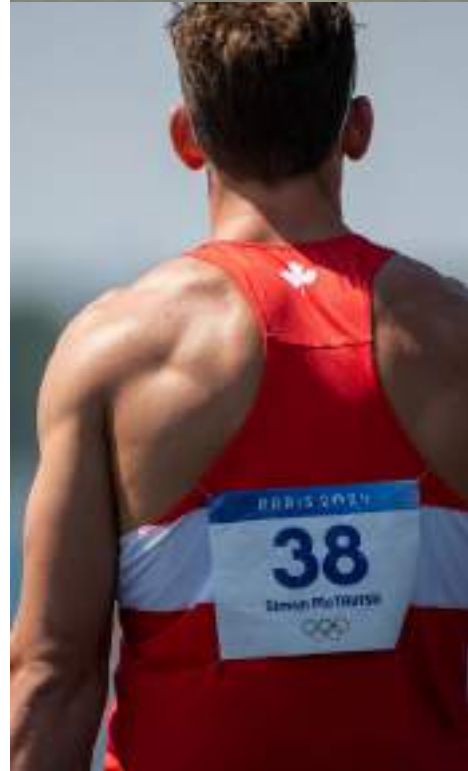

LOCAL TRANSPORTATION

All Participants in official accommodations will be issued an unlimited metro pass for the duration of their stay. Each official hotel is located in close proximity to a metro station, as is the competition venue. This option allows all participants to set their own schedule, to further explore the city, and also contribute to a more environmentally sustainable World Cup.

We kindly ask that participants staying in official accommodations who require special shuttles that can accommodate mobility needs please indicate those needs through the [Tournkey Registration Link](#) so we can plan accordingly.

AIRPORT TRANSFERS

Airport transfers will be made available to participants staying at the above accommodations. Participants will be required to pay a round-trip or one-way fee to cover these costs. Transportation requests can be submitted simultaneously with your accommodation request so that an all-inclusive cost per person is presented to your federation. 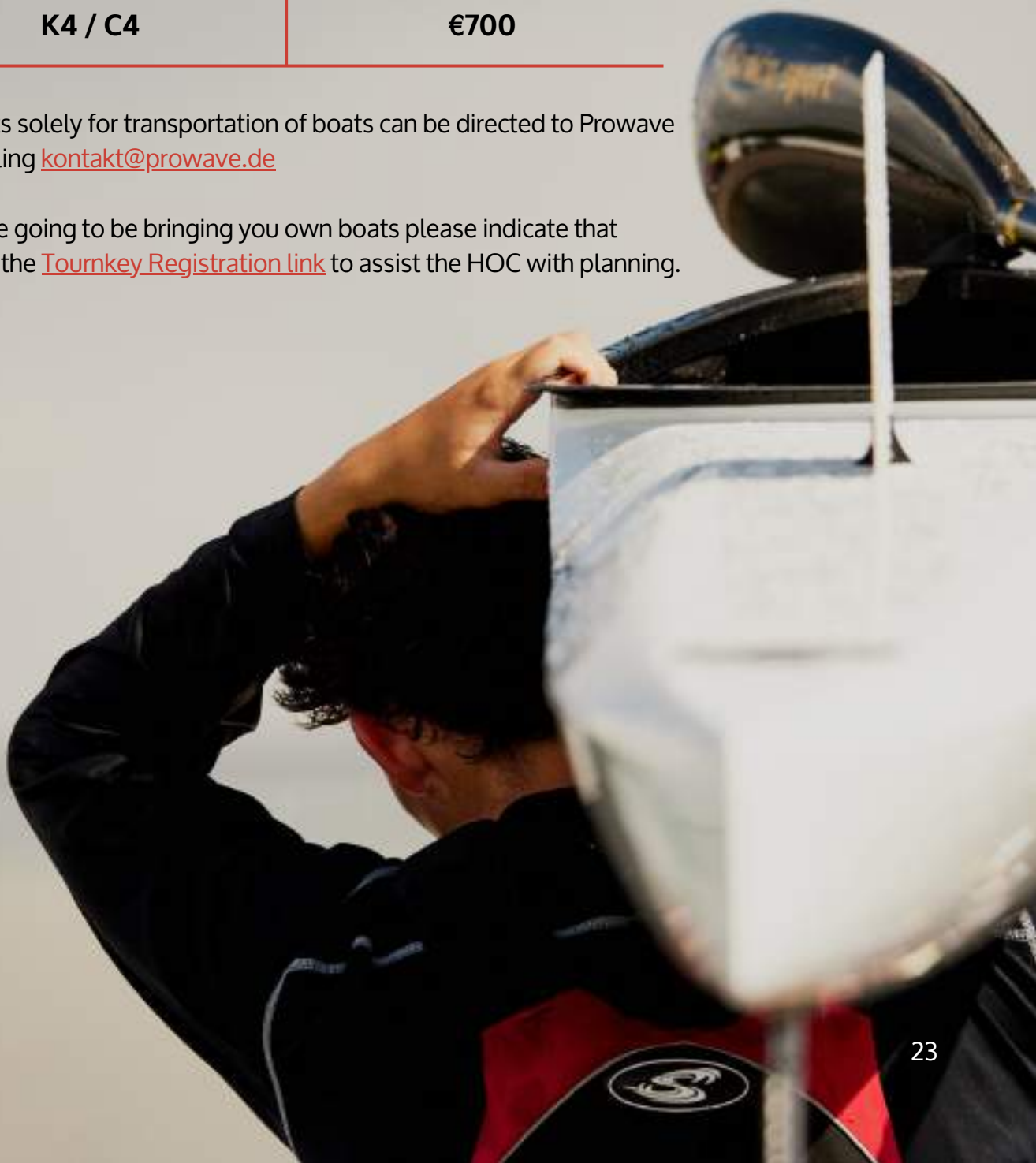
